

Lesson Plan for Teacher/Counselor:

Thank you for your assistance in helping students to develop their futures! On the following pages you will see prepared lesson plans. It is very important that all students have completed the assessment on Missouri Connections prior to attending the event and have identified a Career Path and a corresponding color.

The 4-day (including day of event) lesson is planned in conjunction with the communication arts grade level expectations for Grade 10. The lesson can be conducted by either the guidance counselor or a classroom teacher. Two days are spent prior to attendance at My Success Event. Day 1 requires access to the Internet. Day 2 is a classroom day. Day 3 is the experience at My Success Event. Day 4 is a follow-up to the Event.

Day 1 Prior to event

- 1. Instruct all students to open website <u>www.themysuccessevent.com</u>.
- 2. Click on "Students".
 - Allow students 5-10 minutes to explore the website and encourage them to watch the video that is found on the home page.
- 3. Allow 5 minutes for questions/discussion about planning for future careers.
- 4. Instruct students to open website www.missouriconnections.org
- 5. Students will be given the school username and password to enter the website by the teacher.
- 6. Once into the website, create your portfolio by clicking Create "My Portfolio" and New User. Enter your personal data, create your own username and password, and click submit. This will allow students to save all of their completed work and information gathered on the Missouri Connections website. Return to Home Page.
- 7. On the left hand side of the page, click on "Career Cluster Inventory". Follow the directions and begin the assessment. Upon completion, the students will view their Career Pathway rankings. If there is more than one career path given among the top 3 cluster names, have the student note both on their worksheet. Have students complete Worksheet Number 1.
- 8. Pay close attention to the career category colors; they are different than the 6 Main Pathway Colors. (examples follow worksheet 1).
- 9. Collect the worksheets to be used for Day 2.

Day 2 Prior to event

1. Complete worksheet Number 2 which involves group activities. (See Worksheet 2)

Day 3 Attend Event -


- 1. Have FUN!!

1. Complete worksheets Number 3 and 4.



Worksheet Number 2

- 1. Identify the career pathway, indicated in the interest survey, such as human services, health services, business management and technology, arts and communication, industrial and engineering technology, and natural resources from Day 1 that you are interested in considering for a profession.
- 2. For five minutes, free write what you know about the career pathway. Simply write without lifting your pencil or pen on the topic. What jobs are in the pathway? What kind of work is involved? What is the training that is required? Who do you know in the field? What do you not know about the area but need to know?
- 3. Get in groups based on the career path of choice. Share the free writes from number 2.
- 4. For an additional 2 minutes, students add additional thoughts to your paragraph.
- 5. Identify what additional information is needed to make a career choice. List the information.
